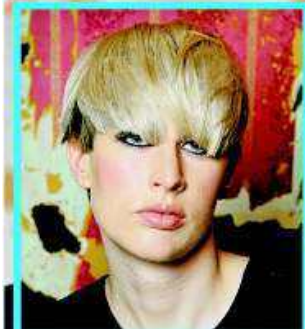

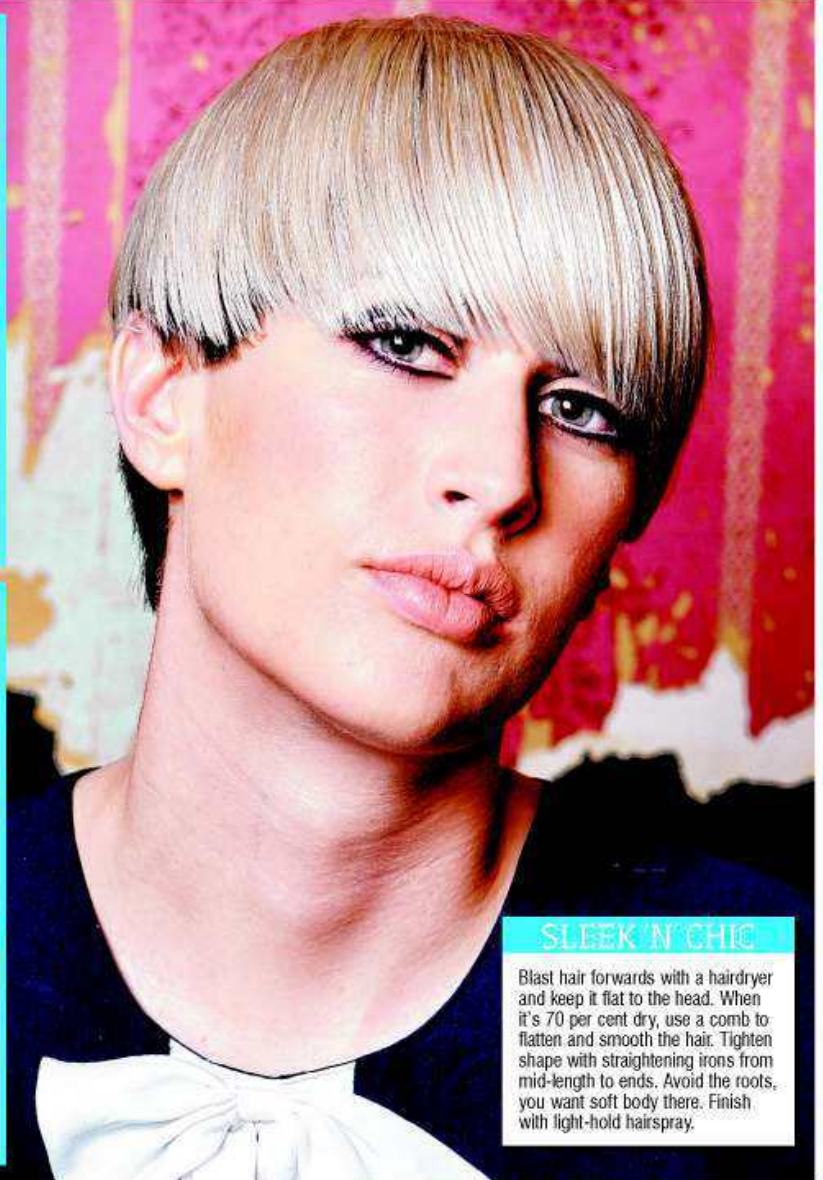
ULTIMATE TWIGGY

Use the same technique as the sleek 'n' chic look, minus the straighteners. Use a small brush and blow-dry all the hair forward over face. Once smooth, go through and blast with hairspray. Create a strong part, push hair and flatten it across the head, tucking the small side behind your ear.



ROUGH IT UP

Use a diffuser – it gives great volume. Wet hair, apply soft holding mousse and curl serum, lift up the front section of hair and push the diffuser into the hair, in a forward motion. Push against sides to create more squareness in the look and finish with matte wax to rough it out more.



SLEEK 'N' CHIC

Blast hair forwards with a hairdryer and keep it flat to the head. When it's 70 per cent dry, use a comb to flatten and smooth the hair. Tighten shape with straightening irons from mid-length to ends. Avoid the roots, you want soft body there. Finish with light-hold hairspray.

Why are the '60s relevant?

Vidal Sassoon created haircutting as we know it in the '60s. This bob has a strong point of view but it's not too geometric. It's chic and modern, moves well but has a classic edge to it.

Who can wear this look?

It's perfect for oval and heart-shaped faces and a long neck is a big plus. Straight hair is perfect, a soft wave is very good. Ideally, hair will also be fine to medium. If it's too thick it can be disastrous if it's not styled properly. Because the cut is so strong, colour needs to be very soft.

Who should avoid it?

Those with square or wide faces because it would be difficult for the cut to sit flush. They need to go for strong, angulated haircuts rather than round forms.

You've created three looks from the one cut, is short hair always versatile?

Short hair can give you a variety of images if done on the right face shape. The stylist needs to show the client how to wear their hair. My goal is to show Australian women that short haircuts are the most feminine, because they bring out the three major features in the face: cheekbones, jawline and neckline.
